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Existing Florida Incident Duration Timeline

- **FDOT Incident Duration**

- Begins with the time either FDOT or FHP staff is *first* notified of the incident, and ends when all mainline travel lanes are cleared
- Components include notification, verification, response, and clearance times.
- Directly comparable with the FDOT Open Roads Policy of clearing all travel lanes in 90 minutes or less

- **Incident Influence Time**

- Entire length of the timeline from occurrence to return to normal flow

Comparison to National TIM Definitions

- **Roadway Clearance Time**

- Time between first awareness of incident and all travel lanes cleared
- FLORIDA – Incident Duration

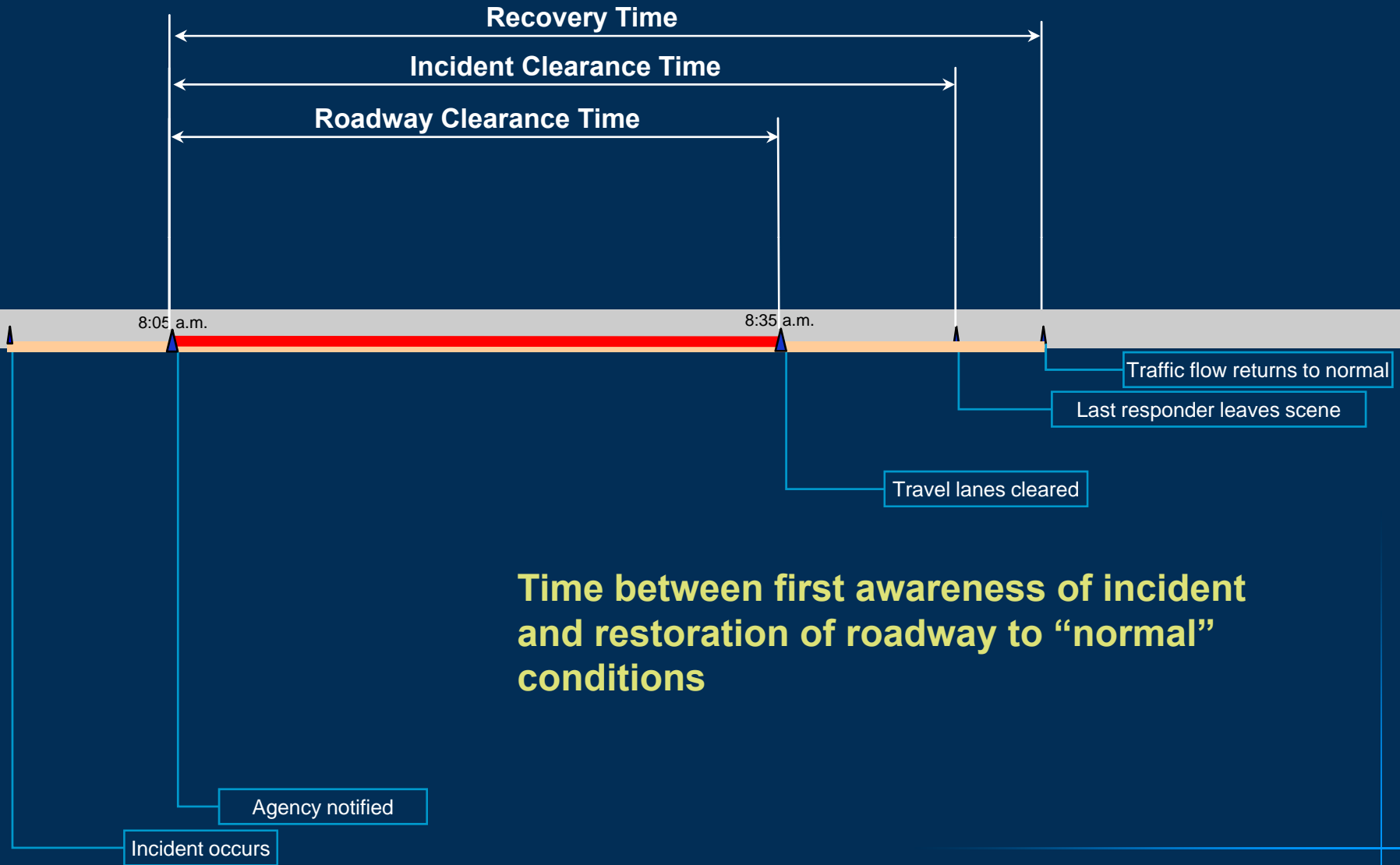
- **Incident Clearance Time**

- Time between first awareness of incident and time at which the last responder has left the scene
- FLORIDA – Not defined

- **Recovery Time**

- Time between first awareness of incident and restoration of roadway to “normal” conditions
- FLORIDA – Not defined

National Incident Duration Timeline



Proposed Revisions to Incident Duration Timeline

- **Terminology Changes**
 - **FDOT Incident Duration → FDOT Roadway Clearance Time**
 - **Clearance Time → Open Roads Time**
- **Additional Components (to be measured/reported later)**
 - **Incident Clearance Time**
 - **Recovery Time**
